No Sleep 'Til Brooklyn

Runaway are New York based DJ and producer duo **Jacques Renault** and **Marcos Cabral**, who have been responsible for a number of releases, the latest of which is "Brooklyn Club Jam", their ode to the good old days of Chicago house, released this summer on **Rekids**.

This track begins with an absolutely thundering drum beat which you could be forgiven for thinking is about to launch into a heavy fidget-type affair, but this is before the piano creeps in setting the soulful tone for the seven minutes that follow. The piano sample duels with itself, moving in and out of time until the satisfying and euphoric drop half way through. This is piano house at its most pure, and has that kind of classic feel with a delicate touch of acid that "Still Going Theme" had last year, and has the same kind of massive crossover potential.

Getting hold of the Rekids 12" could be tricky, but luckily **DFA** are continuing their domination of almost every corner of dance music, and have licensed it for release also. It is now available at the **DFA Webstore**, and should be in all good record stores around about now. And even if you have the Rekids original, the DFA version comes with an awesome **Brennan Green** remix which I think has the slight edge over the **L.S.B.** remix on the Rekids version.
